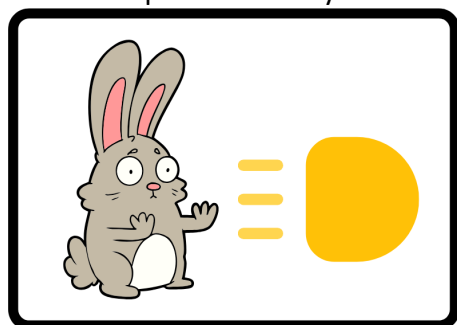
Zadanie 1 IDIOMS
